Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers released **Wisconsin Emergency Order #3** that will go into effect of October 8, 2020 at 8:00 am. **Wisconsin Emergency Order #3** prohibits groups larger than 25% of the indoor room's occupancy, as determined by the local municipality. A place is open to the public if it is accessible to the general public, such as stores, restaurants, bars, or ticketed events.

The City of Oconomowoc Police Department is respectfully asking citizens to voluntarily comply with the order. As a reminder, we encourage everyone to take precautions to keep themselves and others safe. Citizens are encouraged to make their own medical choices based upon what you believe is best for you and your family. We ask all citizens to be sensitive to one another and wear a mask per Executive Order 82.
